

# Project Summary

## China Climate Change Partnership Framework

### The Challenge

Climate change presents a challenge to the achievement of the MDGs and sustaining the hard won gains of developing countries. Global climate change threatens the environment, the health, and the livelihood of the entire planet and its negative impacts will be most evident in the areas of water resources, human health, agricultural sustainability, natural ecosystems, and frequency and scale of natural disasters.

### The Response

In order to pursue a common overarching approach to policy and action on climate change, the 9 UN agencies in China and 12 Chinese partners are jointly launched this Framework. The overall framework encompasses three major areas of focus: climate change policy, mitigation, and vulnerability assessment and adaptation. All the efforts will aim at supporting development of post-2012 strategies, strengthening global knowledge sharing and best practices, piloting clean coal and new renewable energy technologies, and designing adaptation policy frameworks to climate-proof future investments in less developed areas of China.

### Achievements

The joint programme was successfully launched in June 2008, the project PMO has been set up. Three Post 2012 strategies on technology transfer/finance, sector technology transfer, and human development links to carbon budgeting are being drafted ; Series of local and international roundtables have been held for post-2012 strategies discussions; Blueprint for the Global Climate Change Centre and is ongoing through experts from various Chinese institutions and international advisors from UNDP, including review of technical content for the center and business models for sustainable operations; First

draft of Basic Energy Law has been completed and series of local workshops for public stakeholder consultations have been held, towards completion of draft by 2008 and submission to National Peoples Congress; the round table meeting between Chinese and multinational companies to establish the UN-Business Compact on Climate Change has been successfully held in Nov; Local partnerships been established for local design and piloting of biomass technology in household application.
